To meet program needs, applications are currently being accepted for U.S. Fulbright Scholar Awards and a Distinguished Chair Award in Brazil

Scholars interested in lecturing, lecturing/research or research are welcome to apply to the following awards:

FULBRIGHT-FAPESP/SAO PAULO SCIENCE/TECHNOLOGY AND SOCIAL SCIENCES (#0512)

Grant Activity: Conduct collaborative research with occasional lecturing at the graduate level in collaboration with one of several thematic projects supported by the Foundation for the Support of Research in Sao Paulo (FAPESP) in various science and social science fields and developed at institutions in the state of Sao Paulo. Grant length is 2-4 months. For a list of projects see www.fapesp.br/english.

Additional Qualifications: Senior scholars (5 years postdoctoral) are preferred, but junior scholars with strong records will be considered as well.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (#0513)

Specializations: Preferred fields are any area of science or technology with special interest in projects in biofuels, health and environment. Grant length is 3-4 months.

SOCIAL SCIENCES AND HUMANITIES (#0514)

Length: Grant length is 3-4 months.

PUC-RIO DISTINGUISHED CHAIR IN AMERICAN STUDIES (#0013) This is a lecturing only award.

Grant Activity: Teach graduate and undergraduate courses, organize seminars on U.S. history, U.S. studies or both, and develop collaborative research activities with the faculty. Grant length is 3-4 months.

Additional Qualifications: Candidates should have a prominent record of scholarly accomplishment.

Location: Catholic University of Rio de Janeiro, Rio de Janeiro

Notes: *These awards start August 2010 or March 2011. Working knowledge of Portuguese or Spanish is desirable, unless English is acceptable by host institution.*
